Tips for Hydration with an Ostomy

From UOAA's Eating with an Ostomy Guide visit www.ostomy.org/diet-nutrition for more detailed information.

- Drink at least 8–10, eight-ounce glasses of fluids a day.
- Drink fluids with electrolytes such as sodium, magnesium and potassium that are also low in sugar. Dilute sports drinks with water to decrease sugar concentration. Look for oral rehydration solutions that taste good to you.
- Include foods in your diet that are high in water content, such as watermelon, tomatoes, peaches, lettuce.
- Avoid excess caffeine, which can act as a diuretic causing increased urination that leads to dehydration. Always carry a water bottle with you and refill it whenever empty.
- Sip liquids slowly. Don't chug! Chugging will make fluid go through your system too fast to hydrate properly.
- Eat before drinking as food will help absorb fluids. Drink smoothies for an added nutritional bonus, but keep sugar content low.


Her responsibilities with <u>Stomagienics</u> include education, sales, marketing, and customer and distributor relationships.


